**E**VERY thing now tending to the speedy Accession of this Republick to the Treaty of Hanover, the Augmentation of Six Thousand Men in the Infantry is already approved of; and the Provinces of Holland and Guelderland insist upon a more considerable Augmentation, in order to increase the Number of Troops belonging to this State to Fifty Thousand Men. M. Sommelsdyck has by a Letter to the States, confirmed the News we received here some Days ago, of his having forced aground and destroyed, in Sight of Larache, an Algerine Ship of Fifty Guns, which is said to have been the Admiral or Vice-Admiral of Algiers. The Resident of Denmark has lately delivered to the States a Letter from the King his Master, notifying the Queen's Delivery of a Prince.
