NOTICE FOR PUBLICATION ARTICLE RULE 14(1)
THE TOWN QUAY DEVELOPMENT ORDER 202[X]

This is a notice under Article 14(1) of the Transport and Works (Applications and Objections Procedure) (England and Wales) Rules 2006 ("the **Rules**")

The Waterfront (Southampton) Limited and The Waterfront Marina (Southampton) Limited both of Harbour House, 1 Town Quay, Southampton, Hampshire, England, SO14 2AQ have applied to the Secretary of State for Transport under section 6 of the Transport and Works Act 1992 for the above mentioned order under section 3 of that Act.

The draft order makes provision for potential interference with the public right of navigation in the Town Quay of Southampton caused by constructing works below mean high water springs, provides related saving and protective provisions and makes consequential changes to the local harbour legislation of Associated British Ports as statutory harbour authority for the Port of Southampton. The works authorised by the draft order facilitate pier strengthening works to the existing pier, reclamation of land, reconfiguration and extension of the marina, construction of multiple breakwaters, piling, installation of pontoons, new public boardwalks, and the construction of new ferry berths and related linkspans which are required as part of the development proposal. The Order also authorises the stopping up of highway on the existing pier.

The draft order is to be made subject to an environmental impact assessment. A copy of the application, and all of the plans and other document submitted with it, may be inspected free of charge via the website: <https://consultation.thewaterfront-southampton.uk/>

An objection or other representation **MUST** (i) be received by the Secretary of State on or before the expiry date for objections 42 days after the date on which the application was made, being 12 March 2026 (ii) be made in writing (whether sent by post or e-mail) (iii) state the grounds of the objection or other representation (iv) indicate who is making the objection or other representation, and (v) give an address to which correspondence relating to the objection or other representation may be sent. (If you are sending your objection or other representation by email, please provide a postal address.)

The Secretary of State may make complete copies of the objections and other representations public, including any personal information contained in them, and will copy them to the applicant for the order.

NOTICE OF DESIGNATION OF EXTENSION TO THE
HALESWORTH CONSERVATION AREA, HALESWORTH, SUFFOLK
NOTICE IS GIVEN under the provisions of the 1990 Act that East Suffolk Council has determined that the area described in the Schedule to this Notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest, and that it is desirable to preserve or enhance its character or appearance. It has accordingly designated the area as a "conservation area".

The principal effects of this area being designated as a conservation area are as follows:

1. The Council is under a duty to prepare proposals to ensure the preservation or enhancement of the area.
2. Express or Formal Consent must be obtained from the Council for the demolition of any building in the area.
3. Special publicity must be given to planning applications for development in the area.
4. In carrying out any functions under the Planning Acts (and, in particular, in determining applications for planning permission and listed building consent), the Council and the Secretary of State are required to take into account the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area.
5. Six weeks' notice must be given to the Council before works are carried out to any tree in the area.
