ROAD RESTRICTIONS

LONDON BOROUGH OF HOUNSLOW SCHOOL STREETS AMENDMENTS

A. THE LONDON BOROUGH OF HOUNSLOW (SCHOOL STREETS) (AMENDMENT NO.1) ORDER 2026

1. The London Borough of Hounslow hereby gives notice that on 18 March 2026 it made the above Orders, under Sections 6 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The Orders will come into operation on 20 March 2026.

2. The general effect of these Orders will be to:

(a) make the following school streets amendments:

(i) for the existing school streets associated with Smallberry Green Primary School, Hounslow, amend the restriction on motor vehicles accessing Old Pound Close and Turnpike Way during school start and finish times, Monday to Friday 8.15-9.15am and 2.45-3.45pm;

(ii) for the school streets associated with Berkeley Academy School, Hounslow, introduce a restriction on motor vehicles accessing Fairmead Close, and Whytecroft during school start and finish times, Monday to Friday 8.15-9.15am and 2.45-3.45pm; and

(iii) for the school streets associated with The Rosary Catholic Primary School, Hounslow, introduce a restriction on motor vehicles accessing The Green during school start and finish times, Monday to Friday 8.15-9.15am and 2.45-3.45pm.

4. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or any provision contained therein on the grounds that they are not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

LONDON BOROUGH OF HOUNSLOW OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES – CAR PARKS CONSOLIDATION THE LONDON BOROUGH OF HOUNSLOW (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) (CAR PARKS) ORDER 2026
