THIS Day being the Anniverfary of His Majesty's Coronation, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance at Court, of the Nobility and other Perfons of Diftinction; and at Night there were Illuminations, Bonfires, and other publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.

From on Board His Majesty's Ship the Torbay, under the Ifland Hanno on the Coast of Sweden, Oct. 4, O. S. Sir Charles Wager, with the Squadron of His Majesty's Ship under his Command, failed from the Bay of Revel the 20th past, the Wind and Weather being then fair; but the Wind shifted the following Night, and we have had Variety of bad Wind and Weather ever fince; however, we have made a Shift to beat down thus far, with very little Damage to any of the Ships: We put in here last Night, the Wind blowing hard Westerly; and we shall soon proceed for Copenhagen, and thence for England. We kept Company with the Danes till we came off Gotland, where we believe they came to an Anchor; but we chose rather to hold on our Way.
