N the 29th of laft Month this Court went into Mourning for the Death of Prince Maximilian of Hanover, which had been notified by Mr. Dormer His Britannick Majefty's Envoy Extraordinary. The 27th paft Vice-Admiral Somelfdyck and Rear-Admiral Van Coperen failed from hence for Holland, with fix Dutch Men of War. The Infant Don Francifco the King's Brother went laft Week to Zamora Correa to take the Diverfion of Hunting. The Houfe of the Conde de Redondo is taken for the Marquefs de los Balbafes, who pays for it Six thouland five hundred Crufadoes for one Year. It is the Houfe the Queen Dowager of England formerly lived in. His Britannick Majelty's Ship the Durfley, Captain Purvis Commander, failed this Day for Gibraltar. Stockholm, Off. 26. Stockholm, Off. 26. The Orders of the Nobility, Clergy, Burghers, and Peafants, have approved the Proceedings of the Secret Committee in caufing Count Welling's Perfon and Papers to be feized. And it was this Day refolved in the Houfe of the Nobles, That a Tribunal for examining and judging that Count fhould be composed of Twelve Perfons and a Prefident chofen out of the Secret Committee, viz. The Prefident and Six, out of the Deputies of the Nobles; Three of the Clergy, and Three Burghers : That these Thirteen Perfons fhould be chofen by the Twelve Electors who chose the Secret, Committee, and by the other Twelve who were added to them towards chusing the other Deputations; that the Chancellour of Juffice (or Attorney-General) fhould profecute, and that all Count Welling's Papers fhould be referred to this Tribunal.

Hague, Nov. 22, N. S. The Dutch Squadron commanded by Vice-Admiral Somelfdyck, is returned from the Mediterranean into feveral Ports of these Provinces, without having fuffered any Damage by the stormy Weather they had in their Passage.

This Day the Ceremony of delivering the Enfigns of the moft Ancient and moft Noble Order of the Thiftle, by the Right Honourable James Earl of Finlatore, Commiffioner appointed by His Majefty for that End, to his Grace James Duke of Hamilton, was performed in the following Manner at his Majefty's Palace of Holyroodhoufe.

The Commissioner being come to the Royal Apartment at Holyroodhouse, attended by a great Number of Nobility and Gentry, and having given the neceffary Orders for difpoing every thing for the Ceremony, he fent the Lord Lyon King of Arms, for his Grace the Duke of Hamilton, who was in an adjoining Apartment.

milton, who was in an adjoining Apartment. And his Grace was conducted and fupported by two Noblemen, viz. the Marquefs of Tweddale and Earl of Ilay, and ufhered by the Heralds and Purfevants in their Robes, the King of Arms in his Robes, Collar, and Baton going immediately before him, and carrying on a Velvet Cufhion the Enfigns of the Order and his Grace's Commifion, which he placed on a Table near to the Commiffioner.

The Commiffioner delivered his Commiffion from His Majefty, as Sovereign of the Order, to the Lord Lyon, which he received kneeling, and read it in Publick, all prefent flanding.

Then the Commillioner being feated in the Chair of State, and covered, appointed Charles Erskine, Efq; His Majefty's Sollicitor, in Abfence of the Secretary, to administer the Oath of the Order to the Duke, which he accordingly did, and his Grace figned it.

The Lord Lyon kneeling, delivered a Sword to the Commiffioner, who fitting in the Chair, knighted his Grace kneeling in the ufual Form,

Then the King of Arms, in Absence of the Secretary, kneeling, delivered the Ribbon and Badge of the Order to the Commissioner, who put it over the Duke's Neck, and the King of Arms did pin and adjust it.

The Statutes of the Order being prefented on the Knee by the King of Arms to the Commiffioner, he delivered them to the Duke.

fioner, he delivered them to the Duke. Then His Majefty's Commiffion, granting to the Duke all the Privileges of the Knights of the Order, notwithfranding of the Non-Invefiture and difpenfing therewith, was delivered by the King of Arms to the Commiffioner, who delivered the fame to his Grace.

Immediately after the Ceremony, the Heralds, Purfevants, and Trumpets, being ordered by the King of Arms, proclaimed the Duke over the Window of the Royal Apartment, Knight of the most Ancient and most Noble Order of the Thissle.

After the Ceremony was over, the Duke entertained the Commillioner, the Nobility, and many Gentlemen then prefent in a most splendid Manner.
