THIS Day the other three Orders of the States, have agreed with the Nobles in chusing Count Welling's Judges out of the Secret Committee: And the Nobles have already elected their Six.

Lisbon, Nov. 16, N. S. Last Week the Infante Dom Carlos removed from this City to Campo Pequeno, for the Benefit of the Air. The Master of the Horse to the Marquess de los Balbafes is arrived here from Madrid, in order to get ready the House and Equipage for that Minister, who is soon expected at this Court. The 14th died here the Conde de St. Vincente, in the Eighty Sixth Year of his Age. He was General of the Armada. His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Lyme, Lord Vere Beauclerc Commander, continues here.
