Declare Our Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Seventeenth Day of January next, be held, and sie for the Dispatch of di
vers weighty and important Assairs: And the
Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights,
Citizens, and Burgesses, and Commissioners of Shires
and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby
Required and Commanded to give their Attendance
accordingly at Westminster on the said Seventeenth
Day of January next.

GOD Save the KING.

Lisbon, Nov. 27, N. S. Last Week arrived here in 96 Days the Fleet from the Bahia consisting of 50 Merchant-Ships under the Convoy of a Man of War; the other and chief Convoy Ship, of 70 Guns, called the Santa Rosa, met with a most unfortunate Accident coming from the Bahia off Cape St. Augustin; the Powder took Fire, and Ship blew up; out of 600 Men that were on board only seven saved themselves. It is compu-

ted there were near three Millions of Crusados in this Ship. This Fleet brings 11000 Chests of Sugar, and 25000 Rolls of Tobacco, besides a great Number of Hides. At the same time came an East-India-Man, which had touched at the Bahia; the latter has brought a good Number of Diamonds but of no great Value. His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Ludlow-Castle Capt. St. Loo Commander arrived here the 18th Instant from Newsoundland, in order to return soon to England. On Monday Night 1ast a Fire broke out in the Marquess de Valença's House, which burned the greatest Part of it. It was one of the largest and best Houses in Lisbon.
