Great Britain to prepare a Commission for Proroguing the fame accordingly. And We do hereby further Declare Our Pleasure, That the faid Parlia. ment shall, on the faid Seventeenth Day of Janu-ary next, be held, and fis for the Di/patch of di vers weighty and important Affairs : And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Cisizens, and Burgeffes, and Commissioners of Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby Required and Commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Seventeenth Day of January next.

Lisbon, Nov. 27. N. S. Laft Week arrived here in 96 Days the Fleet from the Bahia confifting of 30 Merchant-Ships under the Convoy of a Man of War; the other and chief Convoy Ship, of 70 Guns, called the Santa Rofa, met with a most unfortunate Accident coming from the Bahia offl Cape St. Augustin; the Powder took Fire, and Ship blew up; out of 600 Men that were on board only feven faved themfelves.
