Madrid, December 2, N. S.

THE Count de las Torres, Captain General of Navarre, having been sent for to Court, arrived on the 26th past. It is said his Catholick Majesty designs to give him the Command of the Army which is to be drawn together in Andalusia in the Neighbourhood of Gibraltar; and that Count Montemar is to be made Captain General of the Ports and Towns upon the Coast of Malaga. The Troops intended to form that Army, are on their March, and some of them are already advanced to the Borders of Andalusia. On the 28th past their Catholick Majesties arrived at the Palace here from the Escorial; they were two Days upon the Road, and lay at the Pardillo; her Catholick Majesty being with Child, was carried all the Way in a Chair. Letters from Malaga of the 26th past relate, that Orders were arrived there from Court, for quartering of 10000 Men who are upon their March from Catalonia and Valencia, in the Villages between that Town and Gibraltar: That several Irish Regiments were expected among those Troops, as also 40 Pieces of Cannon by Sea from Barcelona: That the necessary Provisions were getting together for the said Troops, and Hospitals were preparing: That a large Quantity of Small Arms and Musket Balls had been put into the Magazines: And that two Vessels had put in at Malaga, having on board 200 Sailors from Catalonia, bound for Cadiz.

Hague, Dec. 17, N. S. The Deputies of the Province of Gelderland having been to consult their Principals, are returned hither, and this Morning delivered to the States General the Consent of the States of that Province to the second Augmentation of Troops and the raising of the Sums desired by the last Petition of the Council of State, as also to the sitting out of 18 Men of War. The States of this Province of Holland having been reassembled to Day, have likewise consented to the second Augmentation, and to the Sums for repairing the Fortifications, and for other contingent Services.
