DON Lucas Spinola, Son to the Duke of St. Pierre and Captain General of Arragon, arrived here on the 24th Instant from Saragossa, and according to the Orders given him by his Catholick Majesty, set out on the 26th for the Army in Andalusia. It is supposed that by this Time the most considerable Part of the Troops which are to compose the said Army are arrived at the General Rendezvous near Gibraltar, and that the Operations for their intended Enterprize will be begun in a very short Time. Don Luis de Cordoua, Captain General of Guisuscoa, arrived here two Days ago from St. Sebastian; it is believed that he has been call'd to Court in order to consult Matters with him for the Defence of the Frontier towards France. The Duke de Liria, who is appointed Ambassador from this Court to the Czarina, is making Preparations for his Departure, intending to set out in three Weeks by Italy for Vienna, and from thence to Petersbourg. An Express is arrived here from Cadiz, with an Account that on the 22d Instant a Merchant Ship put in there, coming from the Havana laden with Tobacco, after 32 Days Voyage, confirming the Advices formerly received, that the Spanish Admiral Castaneta, with the four Ships under his Command, was safely arrived at the Havana, after a very tedious and troublesome Voyage, which Account has also been confirmed by two Advice-Boats from the Havana lately arrived upon the Coasts of Galicia.
