Lisbon, January 4, N. S.

Tuesday, being the last Day of the Year, their Portuguese Majesties, accompanied by the Royal Family and chief Nobility, went in great State and Solemnity to the Church of St. Roque, to return Thanks for the Blessings received in the Year past. On the 29th past a Marriage was solemnized between the Marquefs de Fontes Son to the Marquefs d'Abrantes (one of the Lords of his Majesty's Bedchamber, formerly Ambassador to the Court of Rome, and now actually appointed with the same Character to that of Madrid,) and the only Daughter of Dom Roderigo de Mello (Son to the Duke of Cadaval,) by a Daughter of the said Marquefs d'Abrantes. The 31st past, three English Men of War, the Sterling-Castle, Winchester, and Solebay, being Ships of Rear-Admiral Hopfon's Squadron, arrived here: The Sterling-Castle had lost her Bow-sprit, Foremast, and Maintopmast, in a violent Storm of Wind which lasted eight and forty Hours: The other two Ships received no Damage, and are preparing immediately to rejoin the Admiral. Mr Dormer, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary, having made Application to this Court, that what is wanting for the Sterling-Castle may be furnished out of the King's Stores, an Order was immediately granted to that Effect; so that the Damage will be repaired in a few Days, and the Ship in Condition to return to her Cruize. By an Express from Vigo this Court has received an Account, that the Pernambuco Fleet, consisting of 24 Sail of Merchant Ships, under the Convoy of one Man of War, was driven by the late stormy Weather into that Port. The Vittoria, a Portuguese Man of War of 60 Guns, which lately sailed from hence, has joynd the Fleet there.
