**T**HIS Afternoon their Catholick Majesties removed from the Palace here to the Pardo, the Queen being carried thither in a Chair. They will reside there till the Middle of next Month. Letters from Gibraltar of the 25th and 27th past relate, that the Governour and the Garrison are not under any Uneasiness there, on Account of any Enterprize from the Spaniards, every thing being there in the best Posture of Defence, and prepared for a vigorous Resistance. Letters from Malaga advise, that the Spanish General the Conde de las Torres arrived on the 29th past at Lucena near the Camp before Gibraltar; that great Numbers of Barrils of Powder and Cannon Ball were sent thither, and that vast Quantities of all Sorts of Provisions were buying up at any Price, without Loss of Time, for the Supply of the Troops. By Letters from Cadiz of the 31st past we have an Account, that four Spanish Men of War, viz the Conquitador, St. Joseph, and two Biscay Ships, had taken in Provisions for four Months, and lay in the Bay ready to sail, (as is given out) for the West-Indies; but that first they are to convoy the seven Spanish Gallies which are ordered immediately for Ceuta, to bring over some Troops from that Garrison; that the Advice Boat which has been ready some time, has received Dispatches from Court, and is to sail forthwith for the West-Indies; that the Battering Pieces of Cannon ordered from Cadiz to the Camp near Gibraltar, are to be sent thither with all Expedition; and that a Road has been made for that Purpose.

Lisbon, Jan. 11, N. S. His Britannick Majesty's Ships the Sterling-Castle, Argyle, and Lyme, remain here. The first is almost refitted and ready to return to Sea again. The Argyle sails in a few Days for England; as does the Lyme for Gibraltar.

Whitehall, January 19.

Last Night arrived one of His Majesty's Messengers, from Lisbon. He had been sent from Lisbon by the Honourable Brigadier Dormer His Majesty's Envoy at the Court of Portugal, with Letters for Rear-Admiral Hopson; whom he found on the 25th of last Month cruising off Cape St. Mary. On the 27th the Messenger left the Rear-Admiral, who having that Day received Dispatches by His Majesty's Ship the Winchester, made sail immediately from off Cape St. Mary, with a very fair Wind, for Gibraltar; where it was judged, the Wind having continued fair, he might arrive the next Day. He had with him the Canterbury, Burford, York, Colchester, Winchester, and Swallow.
