### Madrid, January 6, N. S.

N the 30th paft in the Morning Count Conigleck the Emperour's Ambaffadour at this Court, made his publick Entry. He went with the principal Persons of his Retinue on Horfeback (for which Purpole according to Cuftom a sufficient Number of Horses had been fent to his House from the King of Spain's Stables) and was accompanied by the Conductor of Ambaf-fadours and feveral Gentlemen of his Catholick Majefty's Houshold, through the chief Streets of the Town to the Palace; followed by one of the King's Coaches, four rich Coaches of his own, and those of the foreign Ministers here. After having had his publick Audience of his Catholick Majefly, to whom he made his Speech in Latin, as also of the Queen and the reft of the Royal Family, he was conducted back to his House in the King of Spain's Coach, followed by the reft of the Coaches. Sig. Canale Ambaffadour of Venice as this Court, having complied with the three Years Embally, according to the Statutes of that Republick, took on the

2d Instant his publick Audience of Leave of their Catholick Majesties, but he is to remain here two Months longer ; after which he will go to Paris, where he is to take upon him the Character of Ambaffadour from his Republick. The Abbot de Montgon having taken his Leave of their Catholick Majeflies, intends to fet out for Paris in a Day or two.

Lishon, Jan. 11, N. S. His Portuguese Majesty has been pleased to allign the Apartment lately fitted up in the Palace at Lisbon to the Prince Dom Antonio, upon whom he has fettled an addia tional Revenue of 80000 Crowns a Year, for the Effablishment of his Houshold. His Majesty has given Orders for fitting out a Ship upon a trading Voyage to Macao, which is deligned to bring home the Portugueze Ambassadour from China.
