*Madrid, January 6, N. S.*

**O**N the 30th past in the Morning Count Conigseck the Emperor's Ambassadour at this Court, made his publick Entry. He went with the principal Persons of his Retinue on Horseback (for which Purpose according to Custom a sufficient Number of Horses had been sent to his House from the King of Spain's Stables) and was accompanied by the Conductor of Ambassadours and several Gentlemen of his Catholick Majesty's Household, through the chief Streets of the Town to the Palace; followed by one of the King's Coaches, four rich Coaches of his own, and those of the foreign Ministers here. After having had his publick Audience of his Catholick Majesty, to whom he made his Speech in Latin, as also of the Queen and the rest of the Royal Family, he was conducted back to his House in the King of Spain's Coach, followed by the rest of the Coaches. Sig. Canale Ambassadour of Venice at this Court, having complied with the three Years Embassy, according to the Statutes of that Republick, took on the

2d Instant his publick Audience of Leave of their Catholick Majesties, but he is to remain here two Months longer; after which he will go to Paris, where he is to take upon him the Character of Ambassadour from his Republick. The Abbot de Montgon having taken his Leave of their Catholick Majesties, intends to set out for Paris in a Day or two.

*Lisbon, Jan. 11, N. S.* His Portuguese Majesty has been pleased to assign the Apartment lately fitted up in the Palace at Lisbon to the Prince Dom Antonio, upon whom he has settled an additional Revenue of 80000 Crowns a Year, for the Establishment of his Household. His Majesty has given Orders for fitting out a Ship upon a trading Voyage to Macao, which is designed to bring home the Portugueze Ambassadour from China.
