AN Express arrived at Court three Days ago from the Count de las Torres General of the Spanish Army before Gibraltar, with an Account, that Colonel Kane Governour of that Place having observed his taking a View of it by Land, and also particularly from some Boats in the Bay, sent him Compliments and let him know, that he (the Governour) did not fire upon them, considering that his Person might have been there, but warned him, that if they approached again it should not be suffered; but that if he would satisfy his Curiosity, he (the Governour) would permit him to come into the Place with some few Officers, in order to be convinced of the Strength of the Fortifications; and that the Governour also sent him some Presents of all Sorts of Wines and some Refreshments. By this Express, who was dispatched the 6th Instant from St. Roque, the said Count de las Torres sent Information to the King, that he having several Times viewed with all possible Exactness the Fortifications and Bay of Gibraltar, both by Sea and Land, found the Siege of that Place an Enterprize of much greater Difficulty than it had been represented to him, and that he did not find the necessary Preparations for Beginning such a Work in the Readiness he was promised. What Effect these Representations have had upon his Catholick Majesty, is not yet known; but it is believed the Siege will notwithstanding be undertaken, and Hostilities commenced by the 20th Instant. Letters from Cadiz of the 7th Instant relate, that the Preparations for the Siege of Gibraltar were continued with all possible Diligence. All the Carpenters there were at Work, upon Tent Poles, and several Thousands of Deal Boxes of about a Yard and half in Length, and half a Yard in Depth and Breadth, which are to be filled with Cork, in order to defend the Men from small Shot upon their Approaches. But as they find it very difficult from the Badness of the Roads to send every thing by Land, as at first intended, it was now resolved, that only the Brass Artillery shall go that Way, and they were hiring Merchant Ships to carry the Iron Cannon, Mortars, Bombs, and Balls. And yet notwithstanding the great and perpetual Hurry they had been in Day and Night for three Weeks, there was not any one Thing yet sent away. Only Three or Four of the Cannon had got as far as the Island, which is about two Leagues from Cadiz.
