That the Great God by whom Kings reign may blefs your Majefly, direct your Counfels, profper your Arms, and crown all your Undertakings, with Glory and Succefs, and preferve your Majefly and Royal lifue to fway the Scepter of these Kingdoms to ot, Your Majefty's moft foyal, moft dutiful, and molt Fuithful Subjects and Servants,

Madrid, Feb. 3, N.S. Letters from Cadiz of the 28th of 1aft Month give an Account, that the Pre-parations there for the Siege of Gibraltar were car-ried on with all Diligence. That for a Week before, they had been imbarking a vaft Number of Scaling-Ladders, with the Deal Boxes filled with Cork, (d. feribed in former Advices :) But that, notwithlianding the great Hurry they appeared to be in, it was not yet known when the Sitge could be begun: Becaule though a great Part of the Iron Artil-lery and Ammunition, was already arrived at the Camp; yet the Brafs Artillery, which went by Land, bad not one about Join Latons from Could formed of had not got above four Leagues from Cadiz, fome of it not to far. It was on the 13th of lait Month that Rear-Admiral Hopfon arrived in the Bay of Gibraltar with feven British Men of War.
