To George the Second, by the Grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c.

WE the King's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Representatives of the Freemen of the Province of Pensilvania, in General Assembly met,

Having a true Sense of that unspeakable Loss thy Subjects have sustained by the Death of our late gracious Sovereign King George, of blessed Memory, do at the same time, humbly beg Leave to congratulate the King on his happy Accession to the Throne of the Kingdoms of Great Britain and Ireland, with the Dominions thereunto belonging.

The Succession of a Prince of thy consummate Wisdom and Goodness, under whose Government we with all thy Subjects have so great Assurances of enjoying the Freedom of our Religion and Liberty, as they have been securely and happily transmitted down to us under the Protection of thy Royal Father, could only repair the Loss sustained by his Death.

Long may the King, with that excellent Princess his Royal Consort, live and be blessed with all Blessings Spiritual and Temporal; and may your Royal Issue ever be prosperous and happy, and all your Subjects be, as we sincerely are, thankful to Almighty God for these invaluable Blessings.
