South Carolina.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the President and Council of your Majesty's Province of South Carolina, humbly crave Leave with Hearts full of Affection to approach your Royal Throne, to deplore the Loss of our late gracious Sovereign your Royal Father, of glorious Memory, and at the same Time to express our utmost Joy and Satisfaction at your Majesty's happy and peaceable Accession to the Imperial Crown of your Ancestors.

The great Distance we are from Great Britain, has hindered us from so early making our dutiful Expressions of our Loyalty and Attachment to your Majesty's Government, as other your Majesty's Subjects who have the Happiness to be nearer your Royal Person,

We shall each of us in our Station use our most hearty and sincere Endeavours to promote your Majesty's Honour and Interest, and cheerfully and faithfully discharge our Duties to so excellent a Prince.
