P R E S E N T.

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHĒREAS Information hath been given to His Majesty at this Board, that the Islands of Zant and Corfu are visited with the Plague, and that there is Reason to apprehend that other Places adjacent thereto are likewise infected: Therefore for preventing the Infection being brought by Ships coming into the Ports of this Kingdom, from any of the said Places; and out of His Majesty's tender Care for preserving the Health of His People, His Majesty is this Day pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to Order, as it is hereby ordered,

That all Ships and Vessels already arrived, and not yet unladen, and all Ships and Vessels which shall hereafter arrive in any Port of this Kingdom, from the Islands of Zant, Corfu, Cephalonia, St. Mauro, or any Port of the Morea, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, which shall be reckoned and commence from the Day each Ship or Vessel shall come to anchor in the Place appointed for performing such Quarantine, and not before.

That the Places for performing Quarantine by such Ships and Vessels bound to the Rivers of Thames and Medway, be Standgate Creek, on the South Shore of the River Medway, opposite to the Isle of Grain; Sharpfleet Creek, and the lower End of the Hope; and by such Ships and Vessels coming into any other of the Ports of Great Britain, be such Places as shall be appointed by the Officers of His Majesty's Customs in such Ports, who are hereby impowered and required to appoint proper Places for the same.

That until, and during the Time for making such Quarantine, no Person coming, or Goods imported in any such Ship or Vessel, shall come on Shore or be landed in any Place within this Kingdom.

That whatever Ship or Person shall receive any Men or Goods from on Board any Ship or Vessel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That the Captains of every of His Majesty's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Vessel coming to any of the Ports of this Kingdom, shall take due Care to prevent the landing any Goods, Seamen or Passengers on board the same, until they shall be

put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Customs.

That the Commissioners and other Officers of His Majesty's Customs, do use their utmost Diligence and Care that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majesty's Ships of War; as likewise the Commanders of His Majesty's Forts and Garrisons lying near the Sea Coast, be aiding and assisting to the said Officers of His Majesty's Customs, in stopping all such Ships as aforesaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for Performance of their Quarantine, and in the due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury; the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain; the Master General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance; and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

St. James's May 4.

This Morning their Majesties went to Hounslow-Heath, where the Regiments of Dragoons of Lieutenant-General William Evans and Brigadier Charles Churchill passed in Review before His Majesty, and made a very fine Appearance. In the Afternoon their Majesties returned hither.

Vienna, May 2, N. S. On the 26th past the Lord Waldegrave, his Britannick Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary, arrived here. On the 29th his Lordship had Audience of his Imperial Majesty at Laxembourg. Yesterday the Ratifications of the Preliminary Articles were exchanged reciprocally by the Ministers Plenipotentiary of the several Powers. This Afternoon the Lord Waldegrave had Audience of the Emperour. The Emperour has appointed Count Philip Kinsky to go as his Minister to the Court of Great Britain.

Hague, May 11, N. S. We have Advice from, Dresden, that Field Marshal Count Flemming died of an Apoplexy at Vienna the 30th of last Month. M. Hurgronje one of the Ambassadors Plenipotentiary of this Republick for the Congress appointed at Soissons, is come hither to prepare for his Journey: The other two Ambassadors, viz. M. Goslinga and M. Hop, are expected here in a few Days, in order to their setting out together. M. Pestors, Minister of this State at Brussels,

Brussels, who came hither lately, is preparing to come hither in five or six Days.

Paris, May 12; N. S. Their Excellencies William Stanhope, Esq; and Stephen Poyntz, Esq; two of His Britannick Majesty's Ambassadors Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary for the Kingdoms appointed to be held at Soissons, arrived here last Night.
