HE following Addrefs has been pre-fented to His Majefty by the Right Honourable the Earl of Orkney, introduced by his Grace the Duke of Richmond. Which Address His Majesty was pleafed to receive very gracioully.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty, The humble Address of the Council and Bur-

gefles of Virginia.

Most Gracious Sovereign, YOUR Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Council and Burgesses of your ancient Colony of Virginia, humbly prefume upon this first Occasion of our meeting in a General Affembly, to condole with your Majesty upon the Death of your late Royal Father, of blessed and glorious Memory, which afflicted us in no less a Degree, than the Lofs of fo good and fo renowned a King must necessarily affect a dutiful and a grateful People.

But when at the fame time we heard that your Majefty was placed in Peace upon your Throne; when we faw all Orders and Conditions of Men hastening to acknowlede your undoubted Right and Title, declaring the just Senfe they have of those many Royal Virtues, the greatest Ornament of Princes, which are so conspicuous in your Majesty, and add the brightest Lustre to the Crown upon your Head, and all Factions and Parties as it were at length confeiling themfelves convinced, that the In-tereft and Security of the British Nation are infeparable from your illustrious House, it was impoffible that our Sorrow should not be turned into Gladness. And the Measure of our Joy is filled, when we behold that most excellent Perion our gracious Queen abounding in all the Virtues which are necellary to finish the most diffinguished Character, and educa-ting with a pious Care her Royal Islue in Deincides performed a character for the second Principles perfectly adapted to the English Conflitution.

It is the peculiar Happinels of this Country, that we are more than any other of the American Plantations united in the Religion of the Church of England; and our Civil Rights and Liberties are fecured to us by the fame excellent Laws which have ever been the Boaft of the English Nation, and have made them greater than any other People:

Therefore it merits our most thankful Acknowledgements, that your Majesty has been pleafed to declare your Refolution to make the Eftablishment in Church and State your first and always your chief Care.

And as we have always been happy under the Protection and Government of the Crown of England, fo we already at this Diftance feel the extensive Influence of your Majesty's just and wife Counfels in placing over us Mr. Gooch your Majesty's Lieutenant-Governour, who as he reprefents your facred Perfon in your Authority, fo he imitates your Majesty's Piety, Moderation and Justice ; from whence we have no Room to doubt but his Adminiftration will always be acceptable to your Ma-jefty, and eafy to all your People here.

May the God of Heaven long continue to Yourfelf, to your Royal Confort, and all your Subjects, that valuable Life on which the publick Weal fo much depends; may there ne-ver want one of your Royal Line to fit on the Throne of Great Britain; and may your Majefty and your Royal Family be revered while on Earth, and afterwards recorded in Hilto-ry with greater Fame and Glory than your Royal Predecellor from whom this Colony has its Name.
