HIS Majesty has been pleased to order a Commission to pass, appointing the Honourable Lieutenant-General Charles Ross, to be General of the Horse.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Arthur Viscount Irwin to be Lord-Lieutenant and Custos Rotulorum of the East Riding of the County of York, and of the Town and County of Kingston upon Hull.

This Day their Majesties came from Richmond to Hyde-Park, where His Majesty's Foot Guards, viz. the first Regiment commanded by the Right Honourable Sir Charles Wills Lieutenant General of His Majesty's Forces; the second Regiment called the Coldstream Regiment, commanded by the Right Honourable Richard Earl of Scarborough; and the third Regiment commanded by the Right Honourable John Earl of Dunmore; passed in Review before His Majesty, and made a very fine Appearance. After which, their Majesties returned to Richmond.
