IS Imperial Majesty arrived here on the 24th past, late at Night, and surprized us agreeably, being not expected till the next Day; but an Accident which happened in the Houle he was to lie at on the Road haltened his Journey : As the Servants who had gone before to prepare every thing for the Empe-rour's Reception, had laid Part of the Baggage in the Room over that which was de-figned for his Imperial Majefty, one of the Beams being rotten, fell in, and brought down with it a great Part of the Cieling. The Emperour arriving fome Time after, and finding every thing in Confusion, took there-upon the Befolution of coming on the fame upon the Refolution of coming on the fame Night to Gratz. The Beam and Cieling have been fince brought hither, and are to be kept as a Monument of our Monarch's happy Prefervation from fo imminent a Dan-ger. The 1st Instant being his Imperial Majefty's Birth-Day, it was celebrated here with great Demonstrations of Joy : The foreign Ministers, who made a fine Appearance, had the Honour to compliment him on this Occalion : There was likewife a numerous Concourle of Nobility at Court, and a Con-fort of Mufick performed by fome of the beft Italian Mafters. Their Imperial Majefties will remove from hence on the oth Instant to Neustad, and propose to be there on the 8th; but they will not return to Vienna before the 18th Inftant.

Hague, Oct. 15, N. S. On the 12th Inftant the Grand Penfionary of Holland had a Conference with the other Penfionaries appointed to affift him in redreffing the Affairs of the Finances, and 'tis faid they are fettling Regulations for the intended Tax called *Familie-Geldt*, which is like to pass for

two Years this Selfion of the States of Holland, (who met the 13th.) and 'tis computed will produce Six Millions of Florins a Year, applicable to the defraying the Charges of the late Levies and other Extraordinaries. The late M. Pefters's Secretary at Bruffels, is ordered by the States to take Care of their Affairs there, till fome Perfon be named to fucceed that Minister. M. Rumpff is talk'd of for that Employment, which will be difposed of before the States of Holland separate. The Dutchels of Richmond is arrived here from Aix la Chapelle.
