Fontainebleau, Nov. 2, N.S.

INCE the 29th pair nothing particular has happened in the King's Illness; the Small Pox having continued to come out in the best and most regular Manner, His Majesty having been with-but Pain or Fever, and having slept with-out Interruption many Hours every Night; the preceeding Puftules drying up and difappearing gradually, as the others role and came to a Suppuration, and now the Pufules are all dried and falling off. So that all Danger and Apprehension were over two Days ago. Yesterday the King changed Linnen. On Thursday the 4th Instant he will change his Apartment, and on Saturday or Monday next be purged; fo that the Departure of the Court from hence is fixed for the 22d, when it is thought they will go to Marly, to con-tinue there till Christmas. 'Two of the King's Ships were launched the 20th past at Havre, the one called the Ruby defined for Marti-nique, the other called la Gironde to go to Toulon. Toulon. M. Boudin, formerly Phyfician to the Dauphin, and first Phyfician to the Queen, is dead; and is fucceeded by M. Helvetius. M. d'Armenonville, Father to M. de Mor-ville, and formerly Keeper of the Seals, has received the Sacraments, and is at Extre-mity. Her most Christian Majesty went this Morning in Devotion to a Convent at Morette, a little Town two Leagues from hence.

London, October 29. Yefterday Sir Robert Baylis, Kt. Lord Mayor Elect for the Year enfuing, was Sworn at Guildhall, and Sir Edward Becher, Kt. the late Lord Mayor, furrendred to him the Chair and other Enfigns of Mayoralty in the Manner accustomed.

This Day the new Lord Mayor, accom-panied by the late Lord Mayor, Aldermen, Recorder, and Sheriffs in their Scarlet Gowns, went in their Coaches to the Water-Side, the Sword and Mace being carried before them, and the City Officers attending; and from thence proceeded in the City Barge, attended by the feveral Companies in their refpective Barges adorned with Streamers and Pendants to Weftminfter; and having walked round the Hall and folemnly faluted all the Courts, they went to the Exchequer-Bar, and the Lord Mayor did there take the Oaths appointed, and having recorded War-rants of Attorney in the proper Courts, re-turned by Water to Black-Friers, and from thence in Coaches with the ufual Solemnity to Goldsmith's-Hall, where a magnificent Entertainment was provided, at which were present the Great Officers of State, divers of the Nobility, Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, the Judges, and other Perlons of Quality and Diffinction.
