THE States of Holland and West-Friesland have adjourned for some Weeks. During their Sellion they proposed M. de Dieu of Amsterdam to the States-General, to go to Muscovy as Envoy Extraordinary from this Republick. M. Coymans, Envoy from the States to the King of Denmark, having fet out some Days ago from Amsterdam for Copenhagen, M. Assendelst, whom he succeeds is expected here foon, in order to go to reside at Brussels as Minister from the States.
