N Wednefday last arrived here Brigadier General Sutton from Wolfenbuttel, and being introduced to the King, had the Honour to kils His Majeity's Hand. The fame Day the Marquels d'Aix, who has refided fome Years in England on the Part of the King of Sardinia, arrived here from London. Baron Dielcau, His Majefty's Envoy Extra-ordinary from this Court at the Court of Sweden, having obtained the King's Leave to make a Tour hither, arrived here likewife the Day before Yesterday from Stock-holm, and Yesterday Major General Ber-lips had an Audience of the King, to compliment His Majefty on the Part of the Land-grave of Helle Caffel, upon His fafe Ar-rival in these his Dominions. Count Dehn, the Duke of Wolfenbuttel's Minister, de-figns to fet out to Day for Wolfenbuttel, and to return hither again fhortly. There is a Report, that the Duke his Mafter de-figns to come hither to pay a Vilit to His Majefty. M. Reichenback, the King of Pruffia's Secretary in England, paffed thro' this Place a few Days ago, in his Way to Berlin. Since our laft, the King has again made feveral Promotions among the Offic made feveral Promotions among the Offi-cers of his Court. The Weather continuing very favourable, His Majesty takes frequently the Diversion of Walking in his Gardens at Herrenhausen, which are in perfect good Order. To Morrow His Majesty intends to review the Two Bat-tallions of his Foot Courds tallions of his Foot Guards, confifting of 1400 Men, and next Monday there will be a Review of the Horfe Guards.
