## A PROCLAMATION.

**W**HEREAS we have received Her Majesty's Royal Pleasure, that the Parliament of this Kingdom, which now stands prorogued to Thursday the Twenty First Day of August next, should be further prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty Third Day of September next, on which Day it is Her Majesty's Pleasure that they should meet to do Business; We do therefore hereby Publish and Declare, that the said Parliament be, and accordingly the said Parliament is hereby further prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty Third Day of September next, and that the same shall be then held at Dublin, and fit for the Dispatch of Business: Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament are to take Notice, and to give their Attendance accordingly.

*Hanover, Aug. 9, N. S.* On Saturday the 6th Instant, the Officers of the King's Foot-Guards performed the Manual Exercise before His Majesty in Herrenhausen Gardens, who was well pleased with their Dexterity and Exactness. Cyril Wich, Esq, His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Hanse Towns, having that Evening taken his Leave of His Majesty, set out on Sunday Morning early on his Return to his Post at Hambourg, and was accompanied thither by the Hon. Robert Trevor, Esq. The King's Progress to Lunenbourg, &c. to review His Troops, was fixed Yesterday as follows: Thursday the 11th, His Majesty sets out for Hoye, where He will see His Studs, and lie there that Night. Friday the 12th, the King goes to Stade, to view the Fortifications there, by the Way of Verden. Saturday the 13th, His Majesty goes to Harbourg, where He proposes to remain the Sunday. On Monday the 15th, the King sets out for Lunenbourg. The 16th the Review

begins, and will last three Days; and on Saturday the 20th His Majesty goes to the Gohrde. 'Tis generally believed that the King's Stay will not be above six Days at the Gohrde; and that His Majesty will return to Hanover on Saturday the 27th Instant. Yesterday Morning early the Rt. Hon. the Lord Boyne, and Edward Walpole, Esq; set out for Hambourg; and Brigadier Sutton arrived here at the same Time from Cassel. M. Schleinitz, one of the Ministers of the Duke of Wolfenbuttel, is returned hither. Brigadier Sutton and General Dicmar set out together from hence this Afternoon for Wolfenbuttel.
