**T**HE King has named the Marchioness du Muys to be Sub-Governante of the Children of France. His most Christian Majesty is at Rambouillet, but will return in a few Days to Versailles and reside there till the Queen lies in. On the 7th Instant the Abbot de Roye was consecrated in the Church of the Theatins Archbishop of Bourges, by the Archbishop of Rouen, assisted by the Bishops of Beauvais and Ulez.

Hague, Aug. 16, N. S. To Day the States of the Province of Holland and West-Friesland assembled here, and have under their Consideration the raising of Supplies for the publick Service. On Friday last M. van Hoey, Ambassadour of this State to the most Christian King, set out from hence on his Return to Paris. M. Assendelft, whom the States have appointed to be their Minister at Brussels, will soon repair thither, having already sent away his Baggage. M. de Dieu waits only for his Instructions to set out for Muscovy.
