Hanover, September 11, N. S.

ON the 4th Instant at Night, Prince William of Hesse arrived here, and that Evening waited on His Majesty at Herrenhausen. His Highness is lodged in one of the King's Houses in this City, and is attended by his Majesty's Servants. The King has been pleased to create the Rt. Hon. James Lord Waldegrave, his Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Emperour of Germany, a Viscount, and Earl of Great Britain, by the Stiles and Titles of Viscount Chewton of Chewton in the County of Somerset, and Earl Waldegrave: As likewise to confer the Dignity of a Baronet of the Kingdom of Great Britain, on Cyrill Wich, Esq; his Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Hanse Towns: And to grant unto Dr. Richard Knipe one of his Majesty's Chaplains in Ordinary, and now attending his Majesty at Hanover, the Canonry of Christ-Church in Oxford, void by the Death of Dr. Stratford; and on the 8th Instant he had the Honour to kiss his Majesty's Hand. The Differences lately arisen between the King, as Elector, and his Prussian Majesty, relating to the King of Prussia's forcing several of his Majesty's Subjects into his Service, and to the Reprizals made by his Majesty, are now put in a proper Way of being amicably accommodated, by both Parties referring those Differences to the Arbitration of the Dukes of Wolfenbittel and Saxe Gotha; the first of them on the Part of the King, and the latter on the Part of the King of Prussia: Whereupon the Troops on both Sides, which were on their March, are ordered to return to their respective Quarters.

Hague, Sept. 13. Upon Advice of a Convention's being settled between his Britannick Majesty and the King of Prussia, for accommodating their late Differences, the States General have countermanded the March of Eleven Regiments, which were ordered to quarter in their Towns near the Frontiers of the Dutchy of Cleves, belonging to the King of Prussia. And on Saturday last his Excellency the Earl of Chesterfield had a Conference with the Deputies of the States General, in which he returned them the King his Master's Thanks for their Readiness to assist his Majesty, in case of a Rupture.
