H E States of Languedoc will be held the 20th of next Month at Nisines. The Deputies of the Republick of Tripoli are returned home. M. de Romigni, and the Abbot Parquet, are named Grand Vicars to the Archbishop of Paris. A Commission of eight Masters of Requests, and the Grand Almoner of France, is appointed for the Relief of poor Debtors.

Dublin Castle, September 13.
