M De Buffy the French Secretary here, entertained on Tuesday last all the Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, with a splendid Supper, which was followed by a Ball, on Occasion of the Birth of the Dauphin. Count Kinsky, the Grand Chancellor of the Bohemian Chancery, is shortly to be married to the Countess of Palsi. Yesterday his Imperial Majesty took the Diversion of Hunting the wild Boar near Kalten Leutgeben, and at Night returned to his Palace in this City. The Distemper that has raged here for some Time increases daily. The Bills of Mortality which usually amounted to Twelve and Fourteen a Day, are now increased to Thirty Five and Forty. Count Sinzendorff and Prince Eugene are recovered of this Illness, but do not yet go abroad.

Berlin, Dec. 20, N. S. Last Night an Express from Moscow passed through this City in his Way to Brunswick; with Letters from the Czar to the Dutchess of Blankenbourg, his Czarish Majesty's Grandmother, notifying the Conclusion of a Marriage between his Czarish Majesty and the Princess Katharine, eldest Daughter to Prince Dolgorucky.

Hambourg, Dec. 23, N. S. Letters from Moscow of the 1st Instant bring Advice, that the Day before his Czarish Majesty had ordered his Ministers, Generals, and Principal Officers, to attend in his Apartment, and there declared to them, that he had made Choice of the Lady Katherine, eldest Daughter to Prince Alexis Gregory Dolgorucky, for his Consort. The Day following this Resolution was published, and the chief Lords of the Court went to make their Compliments of Congratulation.
