Magistrates of the City of Embden have made fresh Application to the States General upon their being threaten'd with an Aulic Decree, declaring them Rebels, and also menacing them with the Ban of the Empire, notwithstanding all the fair Promises given them from the Court of Vienna. Several Persons of Quality here are preparing to set out this Week to see the Encampment of the King of Poland's Forces, among whom are Count Maurice of Nassau and his Son.
