*Copenhagen, July 25, N. S.*

ON Wednesday the 19th Instant the King of Denmark, with the Queen and the Princess Charlotte, attended by the Grand Chancellor and his Lady, and some necessary Officers of the Court, set out for Walloe, in order to proceed from thence for Holstein. His Majesty passed the Great Belt on the 22d, and is now at Odensee in Fuhnen: The next Remove will be to the Castle of Golding upon the Borders of Jutland; from whence 'tis thought they will proceed directly to Gottorp. The Prince Royal remains in Zealand, with the two Privy Councillours Holst and Pleffe. M. de Plelo having received an Invitation from the King, followed his Majesty Yesterday.

*Dresden, July 29, N. S.* The Electoral Prince had a Fit of the Fever Yesterday, but it was moderate and held him less Time than before. The Marquess de Motti, Ambassadour from the French King, is expected here before his Polish Majesty's Departure for Warsaw, which is fixed for the 16th of next Month: His Baggage was sent away the Day before Yesterday. Colonel Didron, who came, during the Time of the Encampment, and presented, by the King of Sweden's Order, to his Polish Majesty, all the wild Beasts and Birds of the Menagerie at Cassel, took his Leave Yesterday and received a Gratuity of his Majesty's Picture set with Diamonds, to the Value of 5000 Dollars, besides some other Presents, and returns for Stockholm this Evening: His Majesty has made a Present of 12 very fine Polish Saddle-Horses to the King of Sweden.

*Berlin, July 29, N. S.* Letters from Anspach advise, that the King of Prussia has promised the Princess Sophia, his 4th Daughter, in Marriage to the Hereditary Prince of Bareith. His Prussian Majesty sets out Tomorrow from Anspach for Stutgard. Count Lowenhorn, the Danish Minister here, is in daily Expectation of having Leave to go and meet the King his Master in Holstein.

*Hambourg, Aug. 1, N. S.* Baron Sparre, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sweden, has passed through this City on his Return to the Court of Great Britain.

*Hague, Aug. 4, N. S.* A Dispute has arisen between the Zealanders and the West-India Company, about an Incroachment on the Agreement lately made for the former's trading upon the Coast of Africa; the Zealanders pretending that the Liberty of trading ought to extend to Surinam, and the Company insisting upon the contrary, alledging; that they have for a long Time had a peculiar Right to furnish that Colony with Slaves, and even by a Contract with the Society of Surinam, and refuse to depart from it: The Minister of Bavaria was invited Yesterday to a Conference with the States Deputies, on Account of the Jewels pawned to the City of Amsterdam by the late Elector, and pressed the Payment of the Interest, or redeeming the Jewels, declaring that they cannot admit of any further Delays, and must consequently proceed to a publick Sale of them; which the said Minister took Time to report to his Court. M. de Ginkel, Minister from the States to the Court of Berlin, has desired their High Mightinesses's Leave to take a Turn hither upon his private Affairs during the Progress of the King of Prussia; to which they have not yet thought fit to consent.
