Moscow, August 3, O. S.

COUNT Pototsky set out from hence Yesterday to return to Poland, to be present at the Diet of Grodno. During his Stay here he was treated with great Favour by her Czariſh Maſteſty, who conferred upon him the Order of St. Andrew. On the firſt Inſtant Prince Emanuel arrived here from Vienna. Her Czariſh Maſteſty ordered one of her Coaches to meet him, with the Elder Count Levenvolde and ſeveral of her Servants, who conducted his Highneſs to the Palace, where an Apartment was fitted up for him. Yeſterday Morning his Highneſs went to Imoyloff to wait on her Maſteſty, who received him very graciously.

Warsaw, Sept. 2, N. S. His Polish Maſteſty propoſes to ſet out for Grodno about the 20th Inſtant. The Primate arrived here the Day before Yeſterday from Louitz, where his Maſteſty lay in his Way hither. The Plague makes great Havock upon the Frontiers of the Turks Dominions near Camnieck, inſomuch that at Choczim the Baſhaw has left that Town, and is retired to a Place near Fort Trinity belonging to the Poles, and from whence they ſend him Proviſions; but by the Care that is taken, 'tis hoped it will be prevented from ſpreading into this Country.

Hague, Sept. 15, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland are aſſembled, and have hitherto only diſpoſed of the Civil and Military Employments belonging to their Repartition. The Plate of Curator of the Univerſity of Leyden has been conferred upon M. Vander Duſſen, who was the firſt Plenipotentiary at Gertruydenberg. Count Cuſan, the Sardinian Miniſter, has delivered to the States his Credentials from the new King, together with his Maſteſty's Letter of Notification; and the ſaid Miniſter has likewiſe notified to all the publick Miniſters here that King's Acceſſion. The Commiſſioners named to go and ſettle the new Taxes on Houſes, are preparing to ſet out next Week to begin executing their Commiſſion.

The King has been pleaſed to promote Dr. Edward Tenniſon, one of his Maſteſty's Chaplains in Ordinary, to the Biſhoprick of Oſſory in the Kingdom of Ireland, vacant by the Death of Sir Thomas Veſey, Bart. late Biſhop thereof.

His Maſteſty has been pleaſed to appoint Major Francis Leighton, of Brigadier General Barrell's Regiment of Foot, to be Major to Colonel Handaſyd's Regiment of Foot and a Captain of a Company in the ſame, in the Room of Major Sleigh, deceased; And alſo to appoint William Hook, Eſq; to be Major to Brigadier General Barrell's Regiment of Foot and Captain of a Company in the ſame, in the Room of the ſaid Francis Leighton, Eſq;.

WHereas Complaint hath been made to this Court, That great Numbers of looſe and diſorderly Perſons do often aſſemble themſelves at the Place and Times of Execution of the Condemned Malefactors, and that the proper Officers appointed to attend ſuch Executions are frequently inſulted and moleſted in the Performance of their Duty: And that the ſaid Officers who are ordered to aſſiſt the Perſons appointed by the Company of Barbers and Surgeons in carrying a Dead Body of the Malefactors to their Hall to be Diſſected, according to the Act of Parliament, for the Inſtruction of the Members of the ſaid Company in the Science of Anatomy, are frequently abuſed and inſulted, and are ſometimes prevented from carrying away ſuch Dead Body, as aforeſaid. This Court does therefore order, That the Under Sheriff of Middleſex, and the Officers of the two Compters, who are to attend to ſee the Execution performed, do take ſpecial Care to prevent any ſuch Diſturbances and Inſults: And that they aſſiſt the Officers of the ſaid Company of Barbers and Surgeons in carrying away the Dead Bodies to their Hall. And that if any Perſon or Perſons do in any manner oppoſe or hinder the carrying away any ſuch Body, That the ſaid Officers do ſeize and apprehend ſuch Perſon or Perſons, and carry him or them before a Magiſtrate, to be dealt with according to Law. And if any Perſons,



Persons, to the Number of Twelve or more, shall obstruct or hinder the said Officers in their Duty, that then the Under-Sheriff of Middlesex shall read the Proclamation in the Act of the First of King George the First, to disperse such disorderly Persons; And if they continue together in such disorderly Manner for the Space of an Hour after such Proclamation; That then the said Officers do apprehend such Offenders, and carry them before some Magistrate, to be dealt with according to Law. And it is further ordered, That this Order be printed and published in some of the publick News-Papers, and affixed at Newgate, the Place of Execution, and other publick Places within this City and Liberties thereof.
