#### Mofcow, August 3, O. S.

OUNT Pototsky fet out from hence Yefterday to return to Poland, to be prefent at the Diet of Grodno. During his Stay here he was treated with great Favour by her Czarifh Majefty, who conferred upon him the Order of St. Andrew. On the firft Inftant Prince Emanuel arrived here from Vienna. Her Czarifh Majefty ordered one of her Coaches to meet him, with the Elder Count Levenvolde and feveral of her Servants, who conducted his Highnefs to the Palace, where an Apartment was fitted up for him. Yefterday Morning his Highnefs went to Ifinoyloff to wait on her Majefty, who received him very gracioufly.

Warfaw, Sept. 2, N. S. His Polifh Majefty propoles to fet out for Grodno about the 20th Inftant. The Primate arrived here the Day before Yefterday from Louitz, where his Majefty lay in his Way hither. The Plague makes great Havock upon the Frontiers of the Turks Dominions near Caminieck, infomuch that at Choczim the Bafhaw has left that Town, and is retired to a Place near Fort Trihity belonging to the Poles, and from whence they fend him Provifions; but by the Care that is taken, 'tis hoped it will be prevented from fpreading into this Country.

Hague, Sept. 15, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland are affembled, and have hitherto only difpofed of the Civil and Military Employments belonging to their Repartition. The Plate of Curator of the Univerfity of Leyden has been conferred upon M. Vander Duffen, who was the firft Plenipotentiary at Gertruydenberg. Count Cufan, the Sardinian Minifter, has delivered to the States his Credentials from the new King, together with his Majefty's Letter of Notification ; and the faid Minifter has likewife notified to all the publick Minifters here that King's Acceffion. The Commiffioners named to go and fettle the new Taxes on Houfes, are preparing to fet out next Week to begin executing their Commiffion.

And that if any Perfon or Perfons do in any manner oppofe or hinder the carrying away any fuch Body, That the faid Officers do feize and apprehend fuch Perfon or Perfons, and carry him or them before a Magifirate, to be dealt with according to Law. And if any Perlons



Perfons, to the Number of Twelve or more, thall [ obstruct or hinder the faid Officers in their Duty, that then the Under-Sheriff of Middlefex shall read the Proclamation in the A& of the First of King George the First, to differse fuch diforderly Per-fons, 'And if they continue together in such diforderly Menner for the Space of an Hour after Yuch Proclamation, That then the said Officers do apprehend fuch Offenders, and carry them before some Magistrate, to be dealt with according to Law.
