OUNT Pototsky set out from hence Yesterday to return to Poland, to be present at the Diet of Grodno. During his Stay here he was treated with great Favour by her Czarish Majesty, who conferred upon him the Order of St. Andrew. On the first Instant Prince Emanuel arrived here from Vienna. Her Czarish Majesty ordered one of her Coaches to meet him, with the Elder Count Levenvolde and several of her Servants, who conducted his Highness to the Palace, where an Apartment was fitted up for him. Yesterday Morning his Highness went to Ismoylost to wait on her Majesty, who received him very graciously.

Warfaw, Sept. 2, N. S. His Polish Majesty proposes to set out for Grodno about the 20th Instant. The Primate arrived here the Day before Yesterday from Louitz, where his Majesty lay in his Way hither. The Plague makes great Havock upon the Frontiers of the Turks Dominions near Caminieck, insomuch that at Choczim the Bashaw has left that Town, and is retired to a Place near Fort Trihity belonging to the Poles, and from whence they send him Provisions; but by the Care that is taken, its hoped it will be prevented from spreading

into this Country.

Hague, Sept. 15, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland are affembled, and have hitherto only disposed of the Civil and Military Employments belonging to their Repartition. The Plate of Curator of the University of Leyden has been conferred upon M. Vander Dussen, who was the first Plenipotentiary at Gertruydenberg. Count Cusan, the Sardinian Minister, has delivered to the States his Credentials from the new King, together with his Majesty's Letter of Notification; and the said Minister has likewise notified to all the publick Ministers here that King's Accession. The Commissioners named to go and settle the new Taxes on Houses, are preparing to set out next Week to begin executing their Commission.

Hereas Complaint both been made to this Court, That great Numbers of loofe and diforderly Persons do often assemble themselves at the Place and Times of Execution of the Con-demned Malefactors, and that the proper Officers appointed to attend such Executions are frequently insulted and molested in the Performance of their Duty: And that the said Officers who are ordered to affist the Persons appointed by the Company of Barbers and Surgeons in carrying a Dead Body of the Malefactors to their Hall to be Dissected, according to the Act of Parliament, for the Instruction of the Members of the said Company in the Science of Anatomy, are frequently abused and insulted, and are sometimes prevented from carrying away such Dead Body, as afore-said. This Court does therefore order, That the Under Sheriff of Middlesex, and the Officers of the two Compters, who are to attend to fee the Execution performed, do take special Care to pre-vent any such Disturbances and Insults: And that they affift the Officers of the faid Company of Barbers and Surgeons in carrying away the Dead Bodies to their Hall. And that if any Person of Persons do in any manner oppose or hinder the carrying away any such Body, That the said Officers do seize and apprehend such Person or Perfons, and carry him or them before a Magistrate, to be dealt with according to Law.
