Gibraltar, October 12, O. S.

Benjamin Keene, Esq; His Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary to the Court of Spain, accompanied by the Abbé de Mongon, the Abbé de Paresti Minister from Modena, and Consul Cayley, arrived here the 5th, and set out this Day on their Return to Seville, having Yesterday celebrated the Anniversary of the King's Coronation at a splendid Entertainment given to them and to the commanding Officers of this Place on that Occasion by Lieutenant-General Sabine the Governour; and great Demonstrations of Joy were shewn by the whole Garrison.

Stockholm, Oct. 21, O. S. The last Letters from Muscovy assure us, the Czarina has determined to make a Journey to Petersbourg this Winter, and that her Czarish Majesty has formed a new Regiment of Guards, having caused the best Officers and Men to be drawn out of the old ones to compleat this, and given the Command of it to Count Lewenwolde. Letters from the Borders of Finland advise, that the Muscovites had reinforced the Post of Taskula, which divides the two Frontiers, and are buildingⁿ Barracks there.

Copenhagen, Nov. 4, N. S. M^r. Lewis du Pleffen is made chief Minister and Surintendant of the Treasury; Major-General Lewenoern being arrived from Berlin, has been graciously received by his Danish Majesty, who has appointed him to be Secretary at War. It is believed the Princess Sophia, for whom the King shews a most affectionate Regard, will henceforward quit her Country Retirement, and reside at her House in this City, as usual. We expect the Court will remove hither from Friedericksberg some time next Week, and that the King will then appear in Publick. In the mean time, his

Majesty is wholly taken up with reforming and settling Home Affairs, to which his Application is indefatigable.

Hague, Nov. 21, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland resumed their Assembly this Day, and the Grand Pensionary appeared among them. Mess. Goslinga and Hop, two of our Plenipotentiaries to the Congress at Soissons, arrived here the 19th Instant, and have made a Report of their Commission to the States. Admiral Perez is to have his publick Audience To-morrow. Another Minister from the Emperour of Morocco, named Benquetti; arrived here a few Days ago, and has delivered his Credentials; He does not dispute Perez's Commission, but desires to be joined with him, and to have a Share of the Allowance settled upon him, which is 30 Florins a Day. The Directors of the African Company are come hither, to confer with the States Deputies on the Differences they have with the Portuguese concerning their Trade in Africa. The Directors of the East-India Company are returned to Amsterdam, the Decision of their Affair being referred by the States to the Body of Directors of the several Chambers:
