**T**HE 12th Instant the Great Marshal Count Levenvold was betrothed before the Empress to the only Daughter of Prince Chercasky, who will have a very great Fortune, her Father having on his Estate near 30,000 Families of Peasants. The same Day M. le Fort, the Polish Envoy, gave the Order of the White Eagle to Count Biron her Czarian Majesty's Great Chamberlain.

Warsaw, Dec. 13, N. S. On the 9th Instant the Primate left this Place for Lowitz, the Residence of his Archbishoprick of Gnesna, and will not return till the Time of the Conferences; and the Palatin of Kiovia will likewise retire into the Country till that Time. On the 10th Sir Luke Schaub arrived here, and had an Audience of the King the next Morning.

Copenhagen, Dec. 16, N. S. This Day the Body of the late King is to be interred at Rothschild with the usual State and Solemnity; his present Majesty, attended by all the Officers of the Court, and those of the Fleet and Army who reside here, is gone to assist at the Ceremony. An Addition is made of two Members to the Privy Council. Count Altemberg is admitted of His Majesty's Bed-Chamber.

On Christmas Day the King and Queen, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Princess Royal, and their Royal Highnesses the Princesses Amelia and Caroline, with some of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, received the Holy Sacrament in the Royal Chapel at St. James's; the Communion Office being performed by the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of London Dean of the Chapel, and the Sermon preached by the Reverend Dr. Gilbert Dean of Exeter as Sub-Almoner.
