I S Swedish Majesty returned from Hunting the 18th Instant; and M. de Casteja, Ambassadour Extraor-dinary from the most Christian King, had his Audience Yesterday. Vienna, Jan. 3, N. S. Upon New Year's

Day in the Morning their Imperial Majesties. and the Archdutchesses received the Compliments of all the Nobility and Foreign Ministers. On the 2d Instant Cardinal Gri-maldi had a private Audience of the Emperour, at which he delivered to his Imperial Majesty a new Brief from the Pope. It is reported that the Count de Windisgratz, heretofore Ambassadour Plenipotentiary of the Emperour at the Congress of Cambray, is going with a particular Commission to the Court of Spain. The Differences between his Imperial Majesty and the King of Poland are said to be adjusted. On the 31st of last Month the Insante Don Emanuel Prince of Portugal arrived here from Warsaw, and went immediately to the Palace where he had a private Audience of their Imperial Majesties. It has been resolved to augment the Forces on the Frontiers of Hungary to 40000 Men, and to form a Camp there next Spring of 150000 Men. We have Advices from Croatia, that the Ottoman Troops are in great Numbers in the Neighbourhood of Carloftadt.

Hague, Jan. 16, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland refumed their Asfembly this Day, and in all Probability will continue it the next Week, having several Affairs before them which are not yet regulated. The Pensionary affished thereat to Day, as he did the two last Days of the last Week. The Deputies from the Admiralties are still here, in order to assist at the settling the Assairs for the Sea Service for the current Year. Instead of two Ships said to be lost at the Mouth of the Maese with their, Crews by the late Storm, three have perished, one whereof was an English Ship. M. de Nievelt, one of the Burgomasters of Rotterdam, and Deputy to the States of Holland, dying Yesterday at Rotterdam, two considerable Places are thereby become vacant, viz. the Ruard de Putten, which is in the Disposition of the States of Holland; and that of Bailiff and Dykegrave of Schieland, in the Gift of the City of Rotterdam.
