THE Count de Lagnasco, Minister from the King of Poland at this Court, has frequent Conferences with Prince Eugene, on Occasion of the Renewal of the Alliance between the Emperour and his Polish Majesty. The Consul here from the Ottoman Porte has received fresh Orders to return to Constantinople, but he does not appear to be disposed in any Manner to obey these his Orders: The Fate of the late Grand Vizier, who was his Protector, having put him under great Apprehension for himself. The Reis Effendi, or Secretary of State of the Ottoman Empire, is expected here in the Month of March next with full Powers from the new Sultan. The Count de Breuil, Minister from the King of Sardinia, will have in a few Days his Audience of Leave of the Emperour. The Marquis Doria, Envoy Extraordinary from the Republick of Genoa, proposed to make his Entry the 8th Instant, but has been obliged to defer it for some Time. M. Hamel Bruyninx, Minister from the States General, frequents the Court with much Affiduity. The Imperial Troops that are in Silesia, have extended themselves along the Frontiers of Poland, in order to prevent the Communication of the Plague which rages in some Places of Podolia. We have Advice by private Letters from Constantinople, that the Count de Bonneval despairing of obtaining such an Employment as he solicited at the Porte, had taken a Resolution to make a Tour to the Court of the King of Persia.

Hambourg, Jan. 16, N. S. According to private Letters from Moscow, Prince Galitzin did not enjoy long his new Title of Generalissimo of the Russian Troops in the Kingdom of Persia; this Prince dying a few Days after his being advanced to this high Dignity. We have Advices from Copenhagen, that the King and Queen of Denmark are preparing to set out for Holstein. They write from Stockholm, that the King of Sweden seems determined to make a Tour to Hesse Cassel this Spring.

Cologne, Jan. 19, N. S. The Baron de Fonseca, lately Ambassadour Plenipotentiary at the Congress of Soissons, arrived here this Morning from Brussels, and will forthwith pursue his Journey for Vienna.
