H E Count de Lagnasco, Minister from the King of Poland at this Court, has frequent Conferences with Prince Eugene, on Occasion of the Renewal of the Alliance between the Emperour and his Polish Majesty. The Consul here from the Ottoman Porte has received fresh Orders to return to Constantinople, but he does not appear to be disposed in any Manner to obey these his Orders: The Fate of the late Grand Vizier, who was his Protector, having put him under great Apprehension for himself. The Reis Effendi, or Secretary of State of the Ottoman Empire, is expected here in the Month of March next with full Powers from the new Sultan. The Count de Breuil, Minister from the King of Sardinia, will have in a few Days his Audience of Leave of the Emperour. The Marquess Doria, Envoy Extraordinary from the Republick of Genoa, proposed to make his Entry the 8th Instant, but has been obliged to defer it for some Time. M. Hamel Bruynink, Minister from the States General, frequents the Court with much Affiduity. The Imperial Troops that are in Silesia, have extended themselves along the Frontiers of Poland, in order to prevent the Communication of the Plague which rages in some Places of Podolia.
