THE Diet still remains in Inaction; the several Committees and Deputations are examining the Matters referred to them, but none have yet made any Reports to the full Houses. The Queen of Sweden was Saturday, Sunday and Monday last very ill of a Fever, attended with something of a Pleuresy; Yesterday her Majesty was better, but not having slept well last Night, her Majesty is worse to Day.

Hague, March 13, N. S. The States of Guelderland have consented to the Augmentation of 10000 Men, as proposed by Holland; their Deputies, who returned hither last Night, have this Day delivered that Province's Consent to the States General. Those of Utrecht are to meet To-morrow, and it is hoped they will concur likewise to the said Augmentation. The Commissioners of the Admiralty continue here, and very likely will not be dismissed till the Assembly of the States of Holland, which is to begin To-morrow, adjourns. Yesterday his Excellency the Earl of Chesterfield solemnized the Queen of Great Britain's Birth-Day with great Magnificence; all the publick Ministers, several Members of the Regency, and other Persons of Distinction, being invited to an Entertainment; and Fountains ran with Wine for the Populace.
