HE Count de Levolde, and M. Hoffman Resident of Russia, delivered Yesterday their Memorials to the King of Poland in behalf of The former infifts for all the Dissenters in General, according to the Sense of the 4th Article of the Treaty of 1717, as his Polish Majesty explained it by his own Declaration; and he infifts afterwards upon the particular Conventions between Russia and Poland, with respect to the Schismatick Greeks and Roman Catholicks who reside in their respective Dominions. Sir Luke Schaub and Mr. Woodward, the British Ministers, have delivered their Memorials upon the Subject of Dissenters, jointly with the Minister of Holland, to the King; who received them very graciously, assuring them, that he would cause an Answer to be given thereunto, the most favourable he could. The King of Poland's Departure for Saxony is fixed to the 3d of March; the Privy Councellor de Bunau is already set out; the Marquess de Fleury and M. Thioly will depart To-morrow; and the Foreign Ministers will
