**T**HIS being Her Majesty's Birth-Day, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments on Duty, which were drawn out upon Oxmantown-Green. At Noon the Lords Justices met at the Castle, and received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, before whom a Song was performed; after which their Excellencies, attended with the Guard of Battle-Axes, and a Squadron of Dragoons, made a Tour on the Strand. At Night there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other usual Demonstrations of Joy.
