Audiences of her Czarish Majesty. M. Zybin, Prefident of the College of the Mines officiating as Introductor of Amballadours, went with leven Coaches and fix Horses, attended by two Detachments of the Horse Grenadier Guards, to the House for the Entertainment of Ambassadours, to receive and conduct them to the Palace of her Czarifh Majesty; and about Eleven a Clock they came to the Kremelin, or the Court of the Palace, where the two Regiments of Guards of Preobrazenski and Simeneofski were drawn up under Arms in two Lines, through which the Ambassadours, with all their Retinue, paffed, and alighted out of the Coaches at the Palace Gate. M.Chapelloff, Under Marthall of the Court, accompanied by four Gentlemen, received the Amballadours at the Foot of the Stairs, and attended them to the third Hall, which leads to that where they were to have their Audience. At their coming to the Door of the Hall of Audience two Gentlemen of her Majesty's Bed-Chamber, and a Lieutenant of the Chevalier-Guards that were likewife under Arms, received the Ambaffadours and attended them to the first Balister of the Hall in the following Order. The three Ambaffadours from the Emperour of China, preceeded fix others who are come from different Princes of Tartary and the Black Calmoucks, about fix Paces, and the Chief of the three Chinefe walked in the Middle and carried the Letter from the Emperour his Master, wrapt up in Gold Cloth, and delivered it to the Grand Chancellour, who laid it upon the Table placed at the Foot of the Throne. At the Ambafladours entring the first Balister, they fell upon their Knees, and prostrated themfelves three feveral Times, bowing their Heads to the Ground, and then role up. When they advanced within 12 Paces of the Throne, which was raifed with fix Steps, they fell a fecond Time upon their Knees, and then ri-fing up, he that was charged with the Letter, spoke in the Name of the rest, and made a fhort Compliment to her Czarish Majesty, which being explained by the Interpreter, the Grand Chancellor returned an Anfwer to it. The Ambassadours kneeling and pro-ftrating themselves a third Time, took their

Leave of her Majefty, and were reconducted in the fame Order they came to the Palace, HE 26th of laft Month the three the Officers of her Majefty's Houfhold. Her Chinefe Amballadours had their Czarifh Majefty fat upon the Throne under a very rich Canopy, and all the Lords and Ladies of the Court, being richly dreft, made a very fine Appearance, The 28th being her Majesty's Birth Day, all the Nobility and Foreign Ministers appeared at Court in the Morning to compliment her Majesty on that Occafion. The Chinefe Ambafladours were alfo there, and had the Honour to dine in the fame Room with her Majeffy and the Foreign Ministers. At Night there was a Ball, and a fine Firework played off. That Day her Majesty gave the Great Master of her Houshold General Soltikoff, her Relation, 800 Families of Peafants; and gave Leave for M. Narreskin to return from his Exile.

Mofcow, Feb. 8. The 3d Inftant being her Majefty's Name Day, there were, as ulual, great Rejoycings at Court. On that Day her Majefty was pleafed to appoint two of the deceased Felt Marfhal Galitzin's Sons to be Officers in the Preobrazensky and Simeneofsky's Regiments of Guards. M. Von Bracklin, who arrived here fome Days ago, has been declared a Privy Coucellour, and it is thought he will be fent Ambassadour Extraordinary to Copenhagen, to compliment the King of Denmark on his Acceffion to the Throne.

Hague, March 20, N. S. There is Ad-vice, that the Duke of Wolfenbuttel is ve-ry ill, and out of Hopes of Recovery; as al-fo, that the Countefs of Hanau of the Houfe of Anfpach is dead. The States of Holland,. who feparated on Saturday last, after they had disposed of their vacant Offices Civil and Military, are expected again this Day, to meet to Morrow. It being rumoured that thole States have Thoughts of borrowing provisionally three of the fix Millions intended to be railed in cafe of Need, that Sum is already fublcribed at the House of the Receiver General of the Province, though the final Refolution is not yet taken. The Commiffioners of the Admiralties are returned to their respective Colleges ; and no other Orders appear to be illued out, but for difpatching three Men of War intended joyn the three others that are already in the Streights. Captain Schryver is to command the faid three Men of War, and is to carry
