Stockholm, February 24, O. S.

THE 20th Instant there was a full House of the Nobility, when a Project was presented by a Deputation appointed for the better Regulation of that Body, and the Proceedings of it; which, with very little Alteration, reduces into Writing the Forms which were before observed. Afterwards Leave was given to the Members of the Secret Committee to assist at Count Gallowin's Entertainment and Ball, which he gives on Occasion of the Czarina his Mistress's Accession. It begins To-morrow, and is to last three Days. The Queen of Sweden is still ill of her Fever and Ague, and Yesterday found something of it, though it was the intermitting Day. Count Gyllenstierne died on Monday Night at Ten a-Clock; he was a worthy honest Man. M. Sheffer, President of the Parliament, died also the 19th; and the President Stromfelt has been extremely ill.

Dresden, March 8, N. S. On the 4th Instant in the Evening the King of Poland arrived here from Warlaw. His Majesty being very much fatigued with his Journey, retired immediately into his Apartment to rest himself. The 5th the King received, on Occasion of his Return, the Compliments of the Electoral Prince and Princess, as also of all the Nobility.
