HER Grace the Dutchess of Newcastle arrived Yesterday at Rotterdam, and here this Afternoon. Major General Sutton is likewise landed, and expected here this Evening. The Duke of Richelieu left this Place Yesterday to return to his Regiment at Lisle. The Prussian Envoy notified Yesterday to the States the Marriage of the Princess Royal of Prussia with the Margrave of Bareith.

Whitehall, June 12.

On Wednesday last, about Ten in the Morning, their Majesties, accompanied by his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Duke, and their Royal Highnesses the Princesses, and attended by several Lords and Ladies of the Court, came to Hyde Park from Richmond, where the Four Troops of Horse Guards, and the Two Troops of Horse Grenadier Guards passed in Review before His Majesty, performed their Exercise on Foot and on Horseback, and made a very fine Appearance.

Hampton Court, June 12.

On Thursday last, about Noon, their Majesties and the Royal Family came, hither from Richmond. Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Succession to the Throne, great Demonstrations of Joy were shewn here on that Occasion, and at Night there was a Ball at Court.
