It is also required, that the said Certificate be sent by the General Post only, directed to the Rt. Hon. Henry Pelham, Esq; Paymaster General of His Majesty's Forces, at the Horse-Guards, London. And is hereby further notified, that no one will be entered on the Pay Book of the said Hospital,
