OUNT Pototzky arrived here the 20th Inftant, and had Yefferday his firft Audience of her Czarifh Majefty as Envoy Extraordinary of the King and Republick of Poland. Lieutenant General Romanfoff, one of the Senators, Lieutenant Colonel of the Preobrazenzsky Guards, and Knight of St. Alexander, who was formerly Ambafladour at Conftantinople, and not long fince commanded in Perfia, is in Difgrace.

Stockholm, June 16, O. S. The States have been allembled all this Week, Morning and Afternoon, to dispatch the most material Affairs; others of less Importance will be remitted to the King and Senate; both the one and the other relate only to Domeflick Affairs. To-morrow the Separation of the Diet will be proclaimed for next Saturday, Friday being a great Festival here. The Senators Largerberg, Stromfelt, Tornflycht, Barck, Hard, Cronstedt, and Creutz, were Yesterday made Counts; all the other Senators were so before. M. von Kochen, Major General Lowen, Budenbrock, Furstemberg, and Rosen, were made Barons. The Dutchess of Mecklenbourg is expected here son; her Highness's Arrival will determine the Day of the King of Sweden's Departure, his Majesty proposing at present the 28th or 30th Instant; but it is not yet resolved where his Majesty will land; and a Secret will be made of the Place, to avoid Invitations and Ceremony.

Copenhagen, June 30, N. S. The King of Denmark let out for Holftein on the 28th Inftant, with the Queen, and two Princeffes, his Aunt and his Sifter. The High Chamberlain, M. Blome, General Lewennoern, and M. von Hagen, are gone along with the Court. Their Excellencies Meff. Pleffen and Ronfenkrauts remain here. The Jour-

ney, according to the prefent Regulation of it, should conclude in 22 Days.
