*Stockholm, July 7.*

**A**dmiral Taube has been declared President of the Admiralty of Carlscroon, vacant since the Beginning of this Year by the Death of Baron Wachtmeister. M. von Ungern is made Lieutenant-Colonel of the Regiment of Life-Guards, in the Room of Count Spens, who is made Colonel of the Wester Gothie Cavalry, which Baron Kruse resigned in his Favour by reason of his great Age, having, as it is said, been Aide de Camp to the Prince of Condé at the Battle of Seneff. Two Secretaries of State, and all the Governours of Provinces who were not already, have been created Barons. The Court, which went into Mourning the 1st for the Death of the late Margrave Albert, left it off the 4th to celebrate St. Ulrica's Day, and the next, which was the Dutchess of Mecklenbourg's Birthday, when there was a Ball at Court. His Swedish Majesty set out at Eleven the same Night, attended by the Presidents Fersen and Taube, the Major-Generals Orenstedt, Bodingbroke, and During, the Marshal Duben, the Master of Horse Wibel, the Chamberlain Main, the Councillour of the Chancery Norritius, and others. The Barons Uxkul and Palmistietna, two Officers in the French Service, are set out to return to their Posts in Flanders, accompanied by Count Bonde's Son, who was some time ago made a Captain in their Regiment, which is that of the Count de Saxe. The Dutch Minister sets out to Morrow, attended by M. Duben, the Marshal's Son, who is declared Secretary of the Swedish Embassy at the Hague. The Danish Secretary Reifen, who has resided at this Court ten Years, had his Audience of Leave last Week in order to return Home. The

Queen of Sweden was present this Morning in the Senate for the first Time.

*Cassel, July 16, N. S.* The Letters which arrived here from Stockholm the 14th, fixed the King of Sweden's Departure the Beginning of this Month; so that a Courier is expected with the News of his Majesty's landing at Rostock, which is the Rout his Majesty designs to take, in his way hither.
