Dmiral Taube has been declared Prefident of the Admiralty of Carlfcroon, vacant fince the Beginning
of this Year by the Death of Baron
Wachtmeister. M. von Ungern is made Lieutenant-Colonel of the Regiment of Life-Guards, in the Room of Count Spens, who is made Colonel of the Wester Gothie Cavalry, which Baron Kruse resigned in his Favour by reason of his great Age, having, as it is said, been Aide de Camp to the Prince of Condé at the Battle of Senest. Two Secretaries of State, and all the Governours of Provinces who were not already, have been created Barons.
